John Burbank of Rowley, Massachusetts and Some of His Descendants

Generation One

1. John¹ Burbank married say 1640 **Ann** (—).¹ He married say 1643 **Jemima** (—). She died at Rowley, Massachusetts, on 24 March 1692/93.² He left a will on 5 April 1681 at Rowley.³ His estate was probated at Rowley, on 10 April 1681.⁴

William Dibble suggested that John emigrated to New England in 1635 aboard the *Abigail* under the name Joseph Borebanke.⁵ The suggestion, apparently based on

some amount of research, is that names in the original lists were copied as abbreviations and later misread (i.e., "Jo:", meaning John, became Joseph).6 The surname spelling given in the copied lists has occurred throughout the early church records of Rowley. The probability that John married Joanne Jordan, who was listed next to him on the passenger list is a bit much, though, as she was eight years younger. Robert Charles Anderson, in *The Great Migration*, volume 1, simply says he was enrolled to be aboard the *Abigail* and that no evidence exists for their arrival in New England.⁷ In a later volume of the series, in the sketch for George Hepburne (aka Hadborne), Joseph does appear to have lived in Charlestown for a time.⁸ See also Drake's *Founders*.⁹

He became a freeman at Rowley, on 13 May 1640.10

- i. TIMOTHY² BURBANK was born at Rowley, on 18 May 1641.¹¹ He was buried at Rowley, on 14 July 1660.¹²
- 2. ii. John Burbank, b. say 1642; d. 1 June 1709 at Suffield, Massachusetts.

Children of John¹ and Jemima (—) Burbank, all born at Rowley, were:

i. Lydia² Burbank was born on 7 April 1644.¹³

Frederick Clifton Pierce's *Foster Genealogy*¹⁴ claims that Lydia, daughter of Caleb and Martha (Smith) Burbank, married Abraham Foster about 1655. Caleb and Martha did not have a daughter Lydia. Caleb's father, John, did. John's daughter, born 7 April 1644, would have been about 11 at the time of the marriage to Mr. Foster, and 13, in 1657, when the first alleged child was born.

If, Lydia, daughter of John and Jemima (—) Burbank, did marry Abraham Foster, it would have been as his second wife. They would have been married at the earliest, in 1662, and Lydia would not have been the mother of at least three of the children in the alleged marriage. As there is no evidence presented that he did

have a first wife, the whole family unit is suspect.

Lydia Burbank was admitted to full communion at Rowley, on 8 December 1668.¹⁵

Generation Two

2. John² **Burbank** (*John*¹) was born say 1642, and he died at Suffield, on 1 June 1709.¹⁸ He married at Newbury, Massachusetts, on 15 October 1663 **Susannah Merrill**, daughter of Nathaniel Merrill.¹⁹ She died at Suffield, on 10 October 1690.²⁰ He married secondly, at Springfield, Massachusetts, on 15 July 1692 **Sarah (Hart) Scone**.²¹

She died at Suffield, on 19 August 1692.²² There were no children of John and Sarah (Hart) Burbank. He married thirdly, at Springfield, on 9 January 1693/94 **MEHITABLE** (—) **SANDERS**.²³ She died at Suffield, on 24 February 1727/28.²⁴

Louis Dewey states at the beginning of his article that John² Burbank became a freeman at Rowley in 1640.²⁵ This is a misstatement, as he was not born until at least two years later than the event. He participated in the land grants at Suffield, in 1674 but was delayed from taking up the land by King Philip's War.²⁶ He removed from Haverhill, Massachusetts, to Suffield (now in Connecticut) circa 1680.²⁷

- iii. John Burbank was born at Haverhill, in Aug. 1670.³⁰ He died at Suffield, on 25 March 1729.³¹
- iv. EBENEZER BURBANK was born at Haverhill, on 4 March 1673/74.³²

Children of John² Burbank and Mehitable (—) were:

- i. Susannah³ Burbank was born at Suffield, on 23 Nov. 1695.³³ She died at Westfield, Massachusetts, on 19 Dec. 1752.³⁴

He and Martha Smith were admitted to full communion at First Church, Rowley, on 21 February 1685.³⁹

Generation Three

4. CALEB³ BURBANK (*Caleb²*, *John¹*) was born at Rowley, on 1 May 1671,⁵⁵ was baptized at Rowley, on 7 May 1671,⁵⁶ and he died at Boxford, on 1 February 1749/50.⁵⁷ He married on 2 January 1693/94 **Lydia Garfield**.⁵⁸ She died at Rowley, on 3 March 1697/98.⁵⁹ There were no children of Caleb and Lydia (Garfield) Burbank. He married, secondly, at Rowley, on 31 August 1698 **Hannah Acie**, who was born at Rowley, on 9 March 1680,⁶⁰ and she died at Rowley, on 8 January 1762,⁶¹ daughter of John and Hannah (Green) Acie.⁶²

5. John⁴ Burbank (*Caleb*³, *Caleb*², *John*¹) was born at Rowley, on 27 September 1699.⁷¹ He married **Priscilla Major**, born circa 1699,⁷² and she died on 2 November 1730,⁷³ daughter of Benjamin Major and Hannah Bailey.⁷⁴ He married, secondly, before 20 October 1742 **Hannah** (**Hutchins**) **Perkins**, daughter of Samuel Hutchins, and widow of Lemuel Perkins.⁷⁵

He became a proprietor of the town at Arundel, Maine, on 14 February 1726.⁷⁶ He was a lieutenant during the campaign against the French in 1744.⁷⁷

i. John⁵ Burbank was born circa 1752.⁷⁸ He married Anna (Whitten) English, daughter of John and Ruth (Merrill) Whitten, and widow of Capt. – English.⁷⁹

He served in the Revolutionary War in the land and naval services from 1775 to 1779.80 He lived at Lyman, Maine, in 1837.81 He appeared on the 1840 pensioner's census at Lyman, in the household of Reuben Goodwin.82

8. Mary⁵ **Burbank** (*John*⁴, *Caleb*³, *Caleb*², *John*¹) was born in 1733,95 and she died in 1825.96 She married at Bradford, Massachusetts, on 17 October 1751 **John Fairfield**, born at Arundel, in 1728 or 1730,97 and he died at Kennebunkport, Maine, son of John and Mary (Emery) Fairfield.98

Mary's date of birth in Emery is after the date of death of her mother, which date is in the family papers.

Vital Records of Bradford, Massachusetts, to the End of the Year 1849, reveal no Mary Burbank born in 1733, no marriage of John Burbank and Priscilla Major, or any other members of the family as recorded here. There is a marriage entry, at page 187, for a Mary Burbank and "John Farfield," with the date as given in Emery. Emery cites "family records" for Mary's birth and death dates, but with no indication of whose family the records belong to. Notes at the beginning of Bradford vital records indicate that the place was known as parts of Haverhill (after 27 May 1668), Rowley (after 7 January 1672), "Merrimack," and Groveland (after 8 March 1850) at various times. Bradford was annexed to Haverhill on 4 January 1897. There are no records of the family in Haverhill records.99
